Precautionary Statements

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Move to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is Inhalation:

difficult, give oxygen. Get medical attention.

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5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES

6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES
